Please do phone soon so we can talk about the conference; it would also be very useful if we knew what Venice has been doing, & what is happening in Italy. We have really suffered from a lack of accurate, specific information & accounts of political divisions which have some political substance. We have had to make serious decisions acting largely on trust, which is very difficult when

many in the group do not share that trust. It is unnecessary + leads to all kinds of trouble.

The other information which would have been a very great help to us is news of your May Day demonstration. It's too bad that is not reported in the N. American newsletter; it is something of a disaster that it is not in the Journal. It could have been there if someone had written immediately after — that is mostly our fault as we did not request a report. Maybe after the conference we will know each other better + know how to use our international connections + how to prevent confusion.

On the same subject, we have wondered why we received no telegram from you on May 3rd. Perhaps you sent

one, & it didn't arrive? Our march was small, which means that it would have made a great deal of difference to have something from you.

I hope at the conference we'll be able to learn something from your group about how you've been able to work on such a massive scale. We're working pretty hard here, & know what has to be done, but sometimes it feels as if we have our feet in quick mud.

That's all for the moment. Please call soon. I'm really looking forward to seeing you.
